2 Timothy 3:7 *Man is ever learning but never able to come to a knowledge of the truth.*

b. The Bible is a pathway of growth

1 Peter 2:2 ...like newborn babies, long for the pure milk of the word, so that by it you may grow in respect to salvation...

c. The Bible is a pathway of happiness

Luke 11:28 *He replied,* "*Happy are those who hear the word of God and obey it."*

d. The Bible is a pathway of victory

Psalms 119:11 Your word I have treasured in my heart, That I may not sin against You.

e. The Bible is a pathway of hope

Psalms 119:114 *You are my hiding place and my shield; I hope in your word.*
