Contemplative Practices: A View from The Tabernacle of Moses

- 1. Our western approach makes it difficult to understand and practice an embodied faith.
- 2. Tabernacle Teaching:
 - a. **Outer court /The Jesus Court:** sun, moon, stars; open to rational thought and understanding.
 - i) Brazen altar: burn it all; burn fat and kidneys...sweet smell to God?? Really? Why?
 - ii) The death of our flesh always smells sweet to the Lord; die to yourself daily; the blood of Jesus cleanses us of every sin.
 - b. Inner court / The Holy Spirit Court seven branches with 7 bowls lampstand—the menorah: only light now comes from the Spirit of God
 - i) seven spirits of God:
- **Isaiah 11:1-3** There shall come forth a shoot from the stump of Jesse, and a branch from his roots shall bear fruit. ² And the <u>Spirit of the LORD</u> shall rest upon him, the <u>Spirit of wisdom</u> and <u>understanding</u>, the <u>Spirit of counsel</u> and <u>might</u>, the <u>Spirit of knowledge</u> and <u>the fear of the LORD</u>. ³ And his delight shall be in the fear of the LORD.
 - ii) table of shew bread: two stacks of 6; eaten together at the table; "Most holy part of the priests share."
 - iii) Golden altar of incense: must never go out; pray without ceasing. Rev. 5:8 and 8:5//Revelation 5:8 And when he had taken the scroll, the four living creatures and the twenty-four elders fell down before the Lamb, each holding a harp, and golden bowls full of incense, which are the prayers of the saints.
 - c. **Holy of Holies/ The Father's Court**. Only light is the numinous of God; the glory of God resting on Mercy Seat covering the Ark of the Covenant.
