Worshiping the Living God

I. WHAT IS WORSHIP?

- 1. Worship is a response to an invitation.
 - **Rev. 3:20** Behold, I stand at the door and knock; if anyone hears My voice and opens the door, I will come in to him, and will dine with him, and he with Me.
- 2. Worship is an act of surrender.
 - **Rom 12:1** Therefore, I urge you, brothers, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God-this is your spiritual act of worship. NIV
- 3. Worship is an act of attention
 - **Matt 15:8-9** "These people honor me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me. 9 They worship me in vain; NIV
- 4. Worship is an act of participation.
 - **Ps 95:6** Come, let us *bow down in worship*, let us *kneel* before the LORD our Maker; NIV
- 5. Worship is an embodied activity.
 - a. As we engage in genuine worship, our hearts are stirred, hands are lifted, knees are bent, heads are bowed, shouting and singing arise, dancing breaks forth and all manner of physical activity begins to take place.
 - **Ps 47:1** Clap your hands, all you nations; shout to God with cries of joy. NIV
 - b. So we see that worship is *cerebral*, *emotional*, and *physical*. Body language in worship is *biblical*, *reasonable*, and *meaningful*.

II. WHY DO WE WORSHIP?

Augustine said, "Thou hast made us for Thyself, O God, and our souls are restless until they find their rest in Thee."

- 1. Our sense of *finiteness* seeks the *infinite*.
 - a. There is a longing for transcendence, something beyond
- 2. Our sense of *mystery* seeks *understanding*.
 - a. Who am I? Why am I here? Where did I come from?
- 3. Our sense of *insecurity* seeks *refuge*.
 - **Ps 46:1** God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in time of trouble.
- 4. Our sense of *loneliness* seeks *companionship*.
 - a. We all have a need to be known, accepted, and loved
- 5. Our sense of *quilt* seeks *forgiveness*.
 - **Ps 51:1-2,10** Have mercy on me, O God, according to your unfailing love; according to the greatness of your compassion blot out my transgressions. 2 Wash away all my iniquity and cleanse me from my sin....10 Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me.
- 6. Our sense of *anxiety* seeks for *peace*.
 - **Ps 42:1** As the deer pants for streams of water, so my soul pants for you, O God....11 Why are you downcast, O my soul? Why so disturbed within me? Put your hope in God, for I will yet praise him, my Savior and my God. NIV
- 7. Our sense of *brokenness* seeks *healing*.
 - **Isa 53:4-5** Surely our griefs He Himself bore, And our sorrows He carried; Yet we ourselves esteemed Him stricken, Smitten of God, and afflicted. 5 But He was pierced through for our transgressions, He was

crushed for our iniquities; The chastening for *our well-being* fell upon Him, And by His scourging we are healed. NAS

III. WHAT ARE THE ESSENTIAL ELEMENTS IN WORSHIP?

1. Adoration expressed in praise

Ps 103:1 Bless the LORD, O my soul; And all that is within me, bless His holy name. NAS

2. Gratitude expressed in thanksgiving

Ps 106:1 Praise the LORD! Oh give thanks to the LORD, for He is good; For His loving-kindness is everlasting. NAS

3. Repentance expressed in confession

Ps 32:5 Then I acknowledged my sin to you and did not cover up my iniquity. I said, "I will *confess* my transgressions to the LORD"--and you forgave the guilt of my sin. NIV

4. Dependence expressed in supplication

Matt 6:11 Give us this day our daily bread.

5. *Submission* expressed in *surrender*

Mark 14:36 Father, not my will, but Thine be done.

6. Commitment expressed in dedication

Isaiah 6:8 Here am I Lord, send me.

IV. WHAT ARE SOME OF THE OBSTACLES TO WORSHIP?

- 1. Pride
 - **2 Sam 6:12ff** Michal's offense at David dancing before the Lord.
 - a. It was not her *sense of decency* that was offended; it was her *pride!* Beware of a deceptive dignity that really issues forth from pride.

2. A glutted heart

Mark 4:18-20 Still others, like seed sown among thorns, hear the word; 19 but the worries of this life, the deceitfulness of wealth and the *desires for other things* come in and choke the word, making it unfruitful. NIV

- a. We fill our lives with possessions, activities, places to go, and things to do. We can literally choke our hunger for God.
- b. Jeremiah 29:13 tells us that when we search for God with "all our hearts," then we will find him. Our lives are crowded with far too many "other things."

V. What are the Results of Genuine Worship?

1. Genuine worship will be rewarded by God.

Matt 5:6 Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled.

- 2. Genuine worship centers our lives.
 - a. In Revelation 4:2 The first thing we see as we enter God's open door is a throne. Worship is *centering*. It gets us in view of and in touch with the throne of God.
 - b. If there is no center, then there is no circumference. Life is incoherent.
 - c. The result of worship is becoming a centered person. The truth be told, without responding to God's invitation to worship we are nothing but consumers.
